Daniel Alexander Announced as Angel Reach Executive Director

CONROE, TEXAS, January 2, 2024 – Angel Reach announced that Daniel Alexander will be joining the organization as Executive Director as of January 15, 2024 following the retirement of Jean Radach. Alexander was previously the Operations Leader for the South-Central division of Young Life, a nondenominational, faith-based nonprofit ministering to middle school, high school and college students.

“I am exceedingly pleased to welcome Daniel to the Angel Reach team and know he brings leadership inspired by a heart for service and commitment rooted in a sincere love and concern for the youth of our community,” said Charles Maurice, Chairman of the Angel Reach Board of Directors.

After growing up in The Woodlands and attending Oakridge High School, Alexander enlisted in the United States Army just prior to the September 11 attacks in 2001 and served as part of a combat infantry battalion in Operation Iraqi Freedom. Following his military service, he earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from LeTourneau University and a Masters in Business Administration from Concordia University Texas.
